Noblesville strives to be an authentic, diverse, and livable community of excellence where people love to live, work, and play.

NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENTS

- Standard & Poor's upgraded Noblesville's bond rating to AA, citing the city's "very strong economy" and "good financial practices".
- PLANoblesville our 10 year comprehensive plan for future development, redevelopment, and community building projects - was completed.
- The Street Department removed a record amount of snow and began the implementation of their plan to remediate the effects of the Emerald Ash Borer on the city's trees.
- Results of the 2013 Citizen Survey were presented to Common Council and the public in February.
- The Noblesville Parks Foundation was established to ensure continued stewardship of our outstanding park system.
- New businesses including Cabela's and Zevacor Molecular announced their commitment to open in Noblesville in 2015.
- Plans were developed and presented to Council and the public for Federal Hill. The ultimate goal of Federal Hill is to create a downtown gateway that will help generate private development immediately west of the White River.
- NerdWallet chose Noblesville as the 20th Best Small City in the U.S.
- Ivy Tech opened their Hamilton County Campus in Noblesville with an enrollment of 1,257 students.
- A series of public workshops was held this fall for Southwest Quad residents to create a revitalization plan to strengthen this historic neighborhood.

EXCITING NEW INITIATIVES

- The Hamilton County Mass Transit Forum was created with the goal of expanding mobility options within Hamilton County.
- The city and other government entities have partnered and are beginning to evaluate options that will help alleviate traffic congestion on SR 32 and SR 37.
- The Environmental Protection Agency granted approval for 6.5 acres of the old Firestone property to be used for a dog park.
- The Parks Department will continue to expand programming and trails, including more connectivity with existing trail systems.
- The Noblesville Arts Council completed the initial draft of the Noblesville Arts Master Plan in November.




